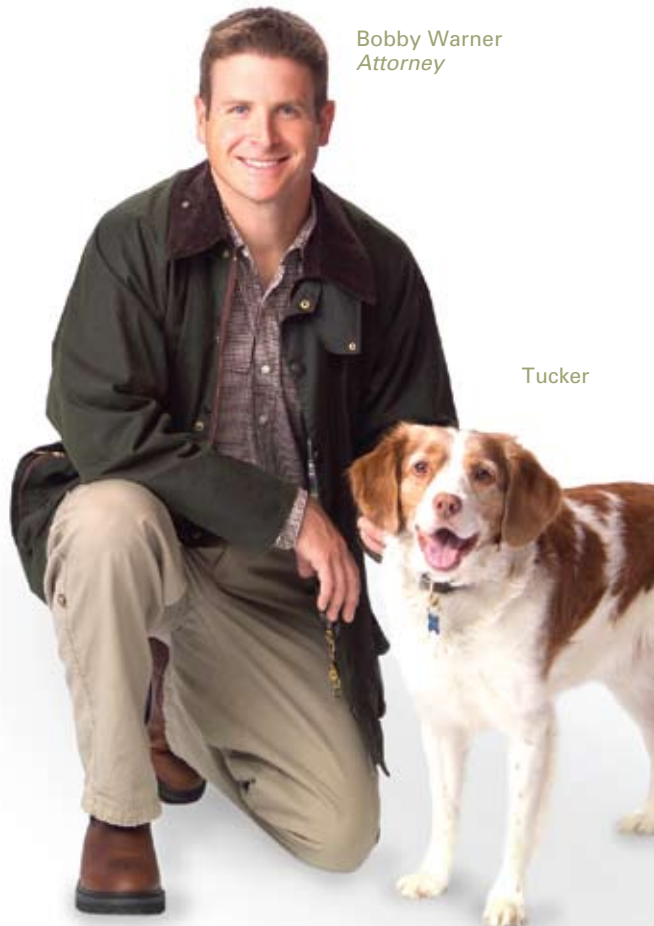

Hunting Safety Tips

Bobby Warner is a strong advocate of the great outdoors. He strongly encourages families to get their children involved in the sport of hunting. The hunting season is in full swing and to help you stay safe, be sure to follow these hunting safety tips:

1. Always keep the muzzle pointed in a safe direction.
3. Be sure of your target and what's beyond it.
4. Be sure the barrel and action are clear of obstructions.
5. Unload firearms when not in use.
6. Never climb a fence or tree or jump a ditch with a loaded firearm.
7. Always wear a full body safety harness when hunting from a treestand.
8. Store firearms and ammunition separately.

Tucker's Tips

A Safer Halloween

Soon, the kids from Bluefield to Bridgeport will be trick or treating, and in their costumes they can be very hard for drivers to see. Your kids will be crossing the street and walking along the sidewalk, so keep them safe from traffic by making sure they are clearly visible to drivers. You can do this in two ways:

- Keep their costumes light. Dress them in light colors like white, or orange, or yellow. However, this only works for kids dressed as ghosts, pumpkins, or bananas.
- Outfit your child with a reflective vest or tape that will light up in drivers' head lights. Make sure your children won't be left in the dark — keep the little monsters visible.

Booster Seats

Air Bags and Children

When combined with safety belts, air bags can go a long way in protecting adults and older children from injury during a collision. But infants and young children can be injured or even killed if they are riding in the front passenger seat when an air bag opens. Air bags open at up to 200 miles per hour in order to protect an average-sized, 165-pound male from injury. While this force is appropriate for adults and bigger kids, it can be dangerous for smaller passengers, possibly resulting in head and neck injuries. Protect your child from air bag injury by following these rules:

- All children under age 12 should always ride in the back seat with their seat belts buckled.
- Never place a rear-facing infant seat in the front seat of a car that is equipped with a passenger-side air bag.
- Place infant seats in the center of the back seat, followed by the back seat behind the passenger seat. A convertible car seat or booster seat should be placed in either the center of the back seat or behind the passenger seat. *If you have no choice and must place a car seat in the front, push the seat as far back as it will go.*

Car Accidents and Teenagers

The statistics for teenage drivers are truly shocking. Car accidents are the number one killer of teenagers. 20% of all car passenger deaths occur when a teenager is behind the wheel, yet teens comprise only 5% of the driving population. Teens are four times more likely to be involved in an auto crash than experienced drivers. Head-on collisions occur more frequently with teen drivers than with any other age group. Teen drivers have a higher per mile crash rate than any other age group.

Product Recall

Hernia Repair Patch

In December of 2005, at the direction of the FDA, C.R. Bard and Davol announced a recall on the large and extra large varieties of their surgically implanted hernia repair patches, known as the Composix Kugel Mesh Patch. Despite having knowledge of the defective design and manufacture of these patches, C.R. Bard and Davol failed to alert physicians about the potential problems and roughly 75,000 of them were sold. The defects have lead to serious and permanent injuries to the implant patients and can result in death.

Warner Law Offices represents individuals who have had these defective devices implanted in their bodies; whether resulting injuries have required the patch to be surgically removed, or the patch remains implanted in the patient but will require continual medical monitoring in the future.

Recent Verdicts & Settlements

Recreational Vehicle Accident

A collision occurred between a recreational vehicle and a barge at night on the Kanawha River. Warner Law Offices argued that the driver of the recreational vehicle was negligent for traveling in the path of the oncoming barge on a navigable waterway. *Recovery \$800,000.*

Insurance Bad Fair

A Putnam County man was diagnosed with terminal cancer. His wife asked her insurance agent if they had an "accelerated death benefit provision" within the life insurance policy, which would have allowed the family to receive \$500,000 to help with costs of care and loss of income. The agent negligently or fraudulantly denied the coverage existed, which resulted in the family losing their business and the ability to provide the best care. *Confidential settlement.*

Workplace Injury

An oil and gas employee working on a drilling rig was severely injured when the company attempted to dislodge ice and debris from a water line by using air pressure and bypassing the regulator. Additionally, the end of line was not properly secured. *Confidential settlement.*

Workplace Injury

Ironworkers were severely injured after being required to use faulty safety equipment. Nylon slings used to hoist rebar over their heads broke, causing rebar to fall and strike ironworkers. Injuries included fractured femur and rebar impaled in leg. *Recovery \$700,000.*
